Section 12 – Genuine Temporary Entrant (GTE) and Genuine Student requirements

The Genuine Temporary Entrant (GTE) requirement, set by the Department of Home Affairs (DHA) as part of the student visa application process, ensures that the student visa programme is not used as a way for international students to maintain ongoing residency, but rather to temporarily enter and stay in Australia. Furthermore, a Genuine Student is someone who intends to obtain a successful education outcome by possessing the language, educational and material background to have a reasonable chance of achieving this.

In addition to submitting a complete course enrolment form, with necessary supporting documents, Everthought College of Construction requires applicants to submit a separate **Statement of Purpose Letter**. Before we begin assessing your eligibility for entry into Everthought College of Construction course(s), you will undergo an initial screening process (based on your Statement of Purpose Letter) which will help us determine whether you would potentially satisfy DHA GTE and Genuine Student criteria. The screening process may include speaking with a Everthought College of Construction representative about your Statement of Purpose Letter. Why we collect your personal information.

As a registered training organisation (RTO), we collect your personal information so we can process and manage your enrolment in a vocational education and training (VET) course with us.

How we use your personal information

We use your personal information to enable us to deliver VET courses to you, and otherwise, as needed, to comply with our obligations as an RTO.

How we disclose your personal information

We are required by law (under the *National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011* (Cth) (NVETR Act)) to disclose the personal information we collect about you to the National VET Data Collection kept by the National Centre for Vocational Education Research Ltd (NCVER). The NCVER is responsible for collecting, managing, analysing and communicating research and statistics about the Australian VET sector.

We are also authorised by law (under the NVETR Act) to disclose your personal information to the relevant state or territory training authority.

How NCVER and other bodies handle your personal information.

NCVER will collect, hold, use and disclose your personal information in accordance with the law, including the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) (Privacy Act) and the NVETR Act. These disorders are intrinsic to the individual, presumed to be due to central nervous system dysfunction, and may occur across the life span.
