

# CPC31320 Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling

The Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling forms part of the Construction, Plumbing and Services Integrated Framework Training Package, and is for people working in the Wall & Floor tiling trade.

Students learn to lay ceramic, clay, slate, marble, glass and other types of tiles on external and internal walls and floors to provide protective and decorative finishes. Major areas of study include interpretation

of plans, measurements and calculations, use of tiling tools and equipment, surface preparation and repairs.
